Flying Field Security:

The flying field is not as out in the Prairie as it used to be. More and more traffic is present on Quincy, and more visitors stop in at the field than at any previous period. In some ways this is good, but in other ways it is not so good. Along with the good minded people that stop by just to see what we do, some undesirables also sometimes stop by.

There have been a couple of incidents lately that prompt me to ask each of you to think about your own safety and security while at the field. We had an incident where an individual was flying by himself, and a couple stopped by with a more than casual interest in his car and what was in the car. Fortunately nothing happened, and the visitors left without incident. Just last weekend, two cars pulled into the field, the drivers got out, used the Porta Potty, got into one car and left the other car at the field locked up. When everyone who was flying decided to leave, they correctly locked the gate behind them locking the car behind our fence. Again fortunately, this ended without incident or damage to our field.

If you are flying alone or in a small group, you might consider locking the gate behind you, or at least closing it with the lock in the pseudo lock position so that it looks locked, even if it is not. Also please remember to spin the tumblers on the lock as you open the gate. If you come to the field with only a few people there and find the gate locked, don't get upset at those who locked the gate behind them. These days there are a lot of crazy things that happen, and we cannot be too careful. As traffic increases on Quincy, incidents like this will be more commonplace unless we take precautions to prevent them.

I have posted some new "Private Property No Trespassing" signs, but more are needed and will be discussed by the board.

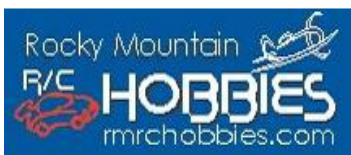
